



## 10276NAT Course in Community Justice Services(Commissioner for Declarations)(Justice of the Peace[Qualified])

### Overview:

This course is suitable to participants who wish to apply to become a Commissioner for Declarations in Queensland. The duties of a Commissioner of Declarations are not to be taken lightly. You have a vital and responsible role to play in the general community. You will at times be dealing with matters of crucial importance to people's lives.

Duties fall into two main categories:

- Witnessing people signing documents as prescribed by law
- Certifying copies of documents

Participants will gain the required skills and knowledge to be able to carry out the above duties effectively as per the Queensland and Commonwealth Law.

### Pre-requisites:

Participants must be:

- An Australian Citizen
- 18 years of age or older
- Of good character
- Registered on the state electoral roll.

### Licence & Regulatory Requirements:

The Queensland Government administers all Justice of the Peace applications. All participants are encouraged to visit the following website prior to enrolling to confirm they meet application requirements. Additional application fees do apply. Please note you must apply within 2 years of successfully completing the course. Once your application is submitted, please allow approximately 3 months for approval.
